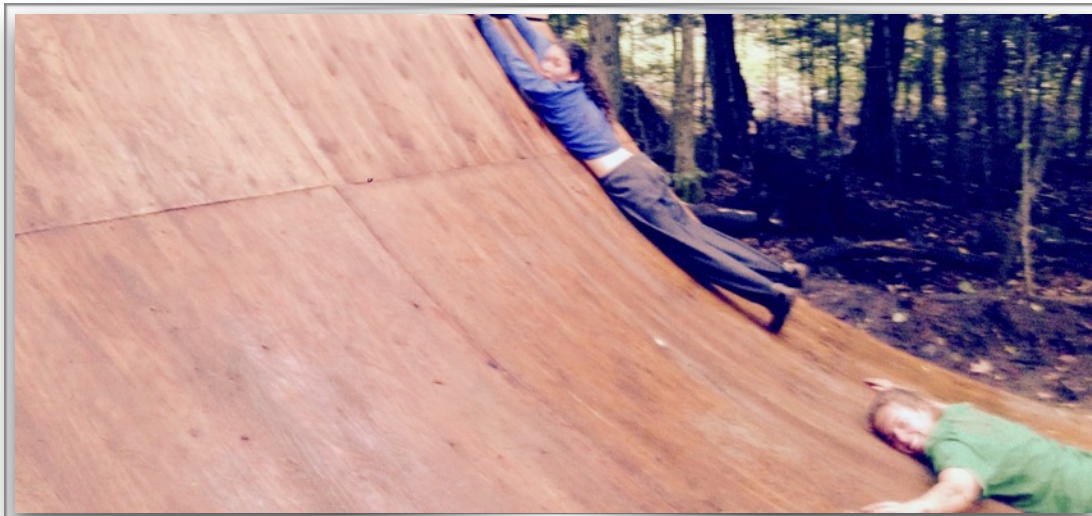
Our Newest Activity...

2. Chicken Snack Wraps

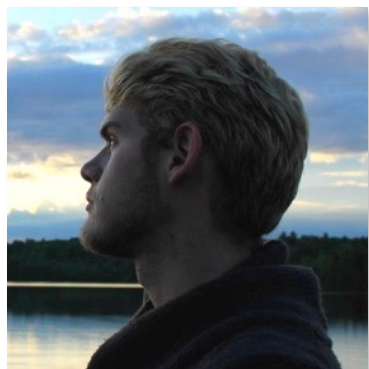

Sky Project: A New Dawn at Pottery

To begin to describe the new pottery barn you have to start with the old one, and start, therefore, with history. My first glimpse into the old

barn is still etched into my memory. Pulling back the big double doors already flaking off years of layered paint, I knew it was a space rich with the past. Dust was everywhere. It crowded in corners and lived in between floorboards. A heavy step in the crooked barn could unleash a little shower of motes. And yet, I was hooked. I spent three wonderful years in that building, giving her a fresh face with paint and filling her with projects borne from a boundless reservoir of inspiration.

In 2015 we were given a new pottery barn, a glistening palace that could demand no less than creativity and passion. A summer came and went within her walls. Projects bloomed into life, each one a camper's dream made tangible.

During the fall I began the herculean task of creating what that old, tilted barn had deep within its walls: atmosphere. The old pottery barn had a charm that was impossible to deny, and the new barn would have to, in some way, rekindle that old creative energy. Bit by bit, I began to craft an environment for the building, streamline the studio space to accommodate any range of potter, but, most importantly, fashion

an area of wonder. My dream for 2016 is that every camper, staff member, parent, or guardian that walks through those beautiful red barn doors is inspired to create. From murals to



help remind campers of techniques, to new characters and projects, the impetus behind each one is to inspire creativity. Mushu was a pet project that began in my first year as Head of Pottery. Now he flies in the air of the barn: a guardian, a character, a creation.

My favourite contribution to the new pottery barn has the most of my heart in it: a grand mural depicting the various stages of the ceramic process. Water and earth combine to create clay, which our blue 'everyman' character moulds into a pot, fires in a blazing fire between his hands, then paints it with colour and soul, only to be fired again until finally the fruits of his labour is revealed: a pot, a glorious pot.

Pottery is one of the oldest art forms in practice. Each pot links us to history, reaching back to early humans who created pots tens of thousands of years ago. The subtle grandeur of pottery is wonderful, but at the end of the day what's most magical is the creation of memories. In pottery, we can make our dreams real. At

camp, we turn our dreams and memories into the light that shines through our days and forges the greatest bonds of friendship.
